UN concerned over safety of thousands of civilians in berm

UN agencies are deeply concerned about the security and protection of the nearly 50,000 people — mainly women and children — who remain stranded at Syria's southern border with Jordan in an area known as the berm, said the UN Spokesperson on 14 August. Air strikes have been reported in the area in the last few days, and the area is reported to be increasingly unsafe. Some people are reportedly attempting to leave the area, risking further danger and deprivation in an inhospitable desert location. The situation for those who remain is worsened by the scarcity of services available in the area, especially food and health care.

Over 600,000 displaced Syrians returned home so far this year, UN agency

More than 600,000 displaced Syrians returned home in the first seven months of 2017, the United Nations migration agency and partners announced in a press release on 11 August. Findings by the International Organization for Migration (IOM) and partners indicate that 84 per cent of the people returning had been displaced within Syria, and the rest returned from Turkey, Lebanon, Jordan and Iraq. Giving youth a chance to become peace builders in conflict-ridden countries

Youth play an important role as agents of change – they are the future of their communities. This year's International Youth Day is putting a spotlight on the role of youth in the prevention of conflict and in building peace. In countries marked by armed conflict or unrest, young people often comprise the majority. According to the Syria Population State Report, in 2014, youth between the ages of 15 and 24 represented 20 per cent of Syria's population. However, in conflict-ridden countries, where their role as peace builders is most necessary, the impact of conflict in Syria is coupled with economic disintegration and social fragmentation, leaving youth feeling overwhelmed and insecure about their future.
