Special Envoy de Mistura attends opposition meeting in Riyadh

Special Envoy for Syria Staffan de Mistura travelled to Riyadh on 21 November at the invitation of the Saudi authorities. The Envoy attended the opening ceremony of the Riyadh meeting. Speaking to reporters, Mr. de Mistura said he believed the meeting will assist the UN-led negotiations in Geneva for a political solution in Syria, based on resolution 2254 (2015). He told opposition leaders that a strong, unified team would be a creative partner in Geneva, and stressed the need for a team that can explore more than one way to arrive at the goals that need to be reached.

Millions of Syrians continue to require humanitarian assistance- UN report

Some 13.1 million people in Syria require humanitarian assistance, of those 5.6 million are facing acute need, according to the latest Syria Humanitarian Needs Overview report released on 21 November. As a result of the disruption caused by hostilities and extensive displacement, access to services as well as livelihood opportunities remain scarce. The report also found that about 3 million people live in hard-to-reach areas, including 419,000 in UN-declared besieged areas. This entails a reduction of 1.9 million people living in hard-to-reach areas compared to last year. In 2017, Syrians continued to bear the brunt of the hostilities in the absence of a political solution, contributing to the world's largest displacement crisis.

Nearly 715,000 displaced Syrians returned home

Between January and October 2017, a total of 714,278 internally displaced Syrians returned to their places of origin within Syria, the International Organization for Migration said on 21 November. A majority of them returned from Aleppo Governorate, many of whom were returning to another area within Aleppo, and 12 per cent from Ar-Raqqa Governorate. The amount of people returning was generally higher in the first half of the year, which was around the time that the Government of Syria retook Aleppo city, and other sub-districts in Aleppo Governorate were liberated from ISIL control. http://www.iom.int/news/nearly-715000-syrian-displaced-returned-home-between-january-and-october-2017

Inter-agency humanitarian convoy reaches Deir Ez-Zor

On 20 November, the UN Refugee Agency (UNHCR) and the Syrian Arab Red Crescent (SARC) dispatched a convoy of 12 trucks loaded with humanitarian assistance to Deir Ez-

Zor governorate in eastern Syria. "Deir Ez-Zor has been the site of relentless fighting for more than three years, and we know that the situation there is desperate, especially now that winter is upon us and people need humanitarian assistance and this is what UNHCR is here to do", said Sajjad Malik, UNHCR's Representative for Syria. The convoy delivered relief items and winterization supplies such as mattresses, blankets and plastic sheets to people in need. UN official condemns attacks on warehouses in Quneitra

Regional Coordinator for Syria Ali al-Za'tari condemned on 21 November the shelling of Syrian Arab Red Crescent (SARC) warehouses in Quneitra, in southern Syria. He said that the UN stands ready to support the SARC in repairing the warehouses and replenishing the destroyed aid to avoid any interruption of relief activities in the area. The UN continues to be alarmed at the escalated violence in eastern Ghouta and Damascus which has resulted in dozens of civilian deaths and hundreds of injuries, many of them are women and children.

Security Council fails to renew investigative panel into use of chemical weapons

Due to the veto of a permanent member, the Security Council failed to renew the mandate of the panel investigating the use of chemical weapons in Syria on 17 November. The draft resolution, tabled by Japan, was rejected by a vote of 12 in favour and 2 against (Bolivia, Russian Federation), with 1 abstention (China). By the text, the Council would have extended the mandate of the Joint Investigative Mechanism of the UN and the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW) for 30 days. The JIM was established by the Security Council in 2015 to identify "to the greatest extent feasible" individuals, entities, groups or Governments perpetrating, organizing, sponsoring or otherwise involved in the use of chemicals as weapons in Syria. https://www.un.org/press/en/2017/sc13076.doc.htm

WFP speaks out against destruction of food supplies in eastern Ghouta

The World Food Programme (WFP) on 16 November expressed strong concerns about the destruction of food intended for hungry people in the besieged enclave of eastern Ghouta, about 15 kilometres from Damascus. The UN food agency said that food distribution points belonging to its local partners were hit by mortars and a quantity of food was destroyed. However, no one was inside the buildings at the time of the strikes. WFP condemned the destruction of desperately-needed food assistance inside Syria. "We urge all parties to the conflict to respect humanitarian principles and allow the safe delivery and distribution of food to families in need, no matter where they are located", the agency said.
