UNFPA delivers aid to previously unreached Sheikh Magsoud in Aleppo

Two mobile reproductive health teams have been deployed to the Sheikh Magsoud area of Aleppo following the arrival of a UNFPA and Syrian Arab Red Crescent mission on 28 December, the first time a UN agency has entered the area with aid for distribution. There are an estimated 65,000 people in need in Sheikh Magsoud, the majority of them women, children and elderly persons. This number is expected to change as more displaced families return to the area. An assessment found significant health-care needs, including severely limited reproductive health services. "Conflict typically puts these women and their babies at risk. Physical hardship and emotional trauma often complicate delivery," said Massimo Diana, UNFPA's Representative in Syria. "Health services are deteriorated after the seven years of crisis in Syria, in addition to the limited supplies and high patient loads. We at UNFPA in Syria are working to deploy emergency supplies and equipment to make childbirth safer and to support medical interventions," Mr. Diana said. On 30 December, UNFPA's mobile reproductive team provided services to over 80 women, reaching those in need of antenatal care, family planning services, postpartum care, and other essential health assistance. Many women had been without care for years. UNFPA and its partner, Syrian Arab Red Crescent, distributed 1,200 dignity kits, which contain hygiene supplies such as soap, sanitary napkins and underwear. They are also planning to open three reproductive health centres in the area as soon as possible, which will provide not only reproductive health care but also services for survivors of gender-based violence. http://www.unfpa.org/news/unfpa-delivers-aid-previously-unreached-sheikh-magsoud-

European Commission Provides Vital Support for WFP Food Assistance in Syria In 2017, the European Commission Civil Protection and Humanitarian Aid Operations (ECHO) contributed US\$22.8 million for the UN World Food Programme (WFP) to provide life-saving food assistance for families across Syria. ECHO support was integral for WFP to assist up to four million people each month across Syria, including the northeastern governorates of Hasakeh, Raqqa and Deir Ezzor. The contribution also empowered WFP with the ability to respond rapidly to new population displacements across Syria. "We know we can always count on the generous support of the European Commission and other partners to reach vulnerable people in need with food assistance,' said Jakob Kern, WFP Representative and Country Director in Syria. "We look forward to our continued cooperation to alleviate the suffering of displaced families in Syria." Yet despite donor support this past year, WFP has recently been forced to reduce its food assistance across Syria and is now reaching 3.3 million people due to insufficient funding. The ongoing conflict in Syria has left almost 6.5 million people facing acute hunger, with an additional four million people at risk of becoming food insecure.
